**Annual Music Ministry Fundraising Concert and Dessert
Sunday, May 5, 4:00 p.m., MICAH Worship Center**

Enjoy music of the spring season presented by all of our church's musical ensembles and soloists, then enjoy desserts provided by the musicians. This annual event provides the majority of funding for new music, guest musicians for special events, and instrumental upkeep.

This year, we are featuring the art work of Barbara Barrick, who created four beautiful watercolor/acrylic paintings at previous music fundraising concerts. Her intent was to donate the works to support our music ministry. These paintings are currently hanging in the Choir Room, and have found a home there. We seek to honor Barbara's intent to donate her artistry to the Music Ministry, and have them available for many people to enjoy.

We are offering donors the opportunity to sponsor one of the four paintings for a donation of \$250 or more. The donation can be designated in memory or in honor of a person, if desired. The paintings will remain in the Choir Room as part of our church. We'll place a donor's plaque with each painting showing the designation.

At the concert, there will be a list of specific donation opportunities, such as sponsoring a Sermon in Song, Christmas, or Easter instrumental or buying a choral anthem or Praise Service song. These gifts may also be designated in memory or in honor of a person, with the designation being recognized in the appropriate bulletin.

Eight decorative planters, provided by Egan Nursery at cost, will be used to make the concert area burst out in spring's splendor. Donors may take one home for a donation of \$40 or more.

Please join us in celebration of the spiritual, inspiring, and powerful moments that our musicians bring to worship by listening to great music, eating dessert, and donating to the Music Ministry.

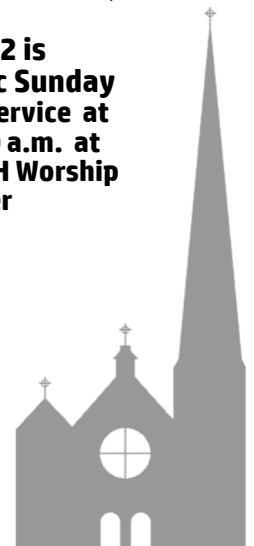

“Interim” No Longer!

We are delighted to announce that Jon Stuber has accepted FUMC’s offer to remove the “interim” designation from his organist position title and would like you to know a bit more about him.

Jon holds BM, MM and DMA from Baylor University and the University of Texas at Austin. Prior to coming to Salem FUMC, he served at First Presbyterian and St. Mary’s Cathedral in Portland, Oregon.

As a pianist/organist, he has appeared with Resonance Ensemble, Consonare Chorale, Portland Vocal Consort, Columbia Chorale, and the Columbia Symphony Orchestra. As a conductor, Jon has appeared in performance with Belle Voci Women’s Ensemble, Lewis & Clark Community Chorale, and the University of Portland Women’s Choir. While completing his doctoral program, Jon made his European debut at Truro Cathedral in Cornwall, England. Musical theatre credits include Musical Director for *The Addams Family*, *Urinetown: The Musical*, *Jesus Christ Superstar*, *Cabaret*, and the upcoming production of *The Great American Trailer Park Musical* at Pentacle Theatre in Salem.

During the day, Jon works at Aldrich Advisors as an Account Manager in the Benefit Administration Division. When not managing benefits or playing music, you can find Jon digging in the garden, frying chicken, or at the movies.

A Special Announcement from Mia Adjali Circle

Mia Adjali UMW Circle has great news! We are changing our name to ***Katherine Parker UMW Circle***. Recently we were moved, inspired, and amazed to hear Katherine talk of her work as a United Methodist missionary to Nepal. Our members chose this way to honor her important efforts.

Our circle has been privileged for many years to be named for another remarkable woman, Mia Adjali. Her impressive accomplishments include service as Executive Secretary of the United Nations International Affairs Council. Both Mia and Katherine provide examples of faithful service and dedication to improving the lives of women, children, and families, an important focus for United Methodist Women locally and around the world.

Celebrating Our Foremothers

Whenever I write about United Methodist Women it's almost always about what we are doing now, whether locally or globally, a discussion about mission giving and what and where the money goes, or the Legacy Fund for the future of United Methodist Women. But what kind of women came before us to make us as strong as we are today. I would like to introduce to Clementina Butler, Grace Stevens, and Martha Drummer. Parts of their stories follow:

Clementina Rowe Butler, also known as "Mother Butler," was one of the founding members of the Women's Foreign Mission Society. She, along with Lois Parker, called together those women on that stormy afternoon in Boston in March, 1869. They set off together to India as the Methodist Episcopal Church's first missionaries. Butler was a tireless supporter for mission work and her daughter Clementina started the first schools of mission in Massachusetts and in 1912 founded the Committee on Christian Literature for Women and Children in Mission Lands that remained open until 1989.

Grace Stephens was an Anglo-Indian missionary serving in Madras, India for the Women's Foreign Missionary Society in the late-19th and 20th centuries. In April, 1886 she was appointed by the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society to be a zenana worker, "zenana" meaning "of the women" and, in the Hindu context, referring to the part of the house reserved for women. She broke down gender barriers, oversaw an orphanage, a boarding school, day school, and Sunday schools as well as her zenana work. Stephens was the only woman from Asia to attend the World Missionary Conference in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1910.

And lastly, *Martha Drummer* was an African-American Methodist deaconess sent as a missionary to Angola in the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society. She served in Quessua - 85 miles from the nearest railroad. In Quessua, in addition to helping run an orphanage for 40 girls, Drummer also provided nursing care and health education and instruction. She was also a popular preacher.

Notes from your Finance Committee ...

Thank you all! We are a very generous and giving congregation.

March had very few categories with large or irregular variances to our budget. For example... Last month our expenses exceeded our income by whopping \$82.58 and through the end of March, our expenses have exceeded out income by \$3,424.

Here are few thoughts on our year-to-date numbers and looking ahead:

- MICAH event revenue is ahead of budget with the legislature using our space regularly while they are in session.
- MICAH “lease” income will remain under budget until Claremont begins its lease mid-year.
- IT expense was a new category this year and we have not needed them as much as in prior years - which is a cost savings to this point.
- In both the Church and MICAH utility categories we are looking pretty good. Current natural gas savings have offset electricity usage excess.
- Yes, we are still meeting our Shared Ministries (Apportionments) obligation. Currently we are paid ahead.
- Total overall year-to-date income is slightly ahead of budget.
